The Knights of Columbus was founded by Venerable Father Michael J. McGivney and a group of parishioners in the basement of St. Mary's Church in New Haven, Connecticut. Father McGivney's vision was to develop a fraternal benefit society that would unite Catholic men in support of the Church, their families, their country and one another. The order received its official charter from the Connecticut state assembly on March 29, 1882.
